

2017 General Election Ballot Measures

STATEWIDE MEASURES

ADVISORY VOTE NO. 16

(Engrossed Substitute House Bill 1597)

The legislature increased, without a vote of the people, the food fish excise tax rate on certain salmon and game fish, costing less than \$1,000.000 in the first ten years, for government spending.

This measure should be **MAINTAINED**

ADVISORY VOTE NO. 17

(Engrossed House Bill 2163)

The legislature expanded, without a vote of the people, the business and occupation tax and narrowed certain retail sales and use tax exemptions, costing \$565,000,000 in the first ten years, for government spending.

This measure should be **REPEALED**

ADVISORY VOTE NO. 18

(Engrossed House Bill 2242)

The legislature imposed, without a vote of the people, an additional state property tax for common schools, costing \$12,949,000,000 in the first ten years, for government spending.

This measure should be **REPEALED**

NOTE: Ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day, November 7.

LOCAL MEASURES

CITY OF OLYMPIA, PROPOSITION 1

(Public Safety Levy) for local law enforcement, code enforcement, and other community services.

This proposition calls for increasing local property tax rate an estimated \$0.45 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation beginning 2018.

This measure should be **REJECTED**

CITY OF TENINO, PROPOSITION 1

(Annexation of City of Tenino into Thurston County Fire District No. 12)

For 25 years, services have been paid by local citizens to the City of Tenino, and in turn paid to Fire District 12. A yes vote will allow Tenino residents to vote on Fire District measures, and run for elective Fire District seats when available.

A **YES** vote is recommended

GRIFFIN SCHOOL DISTRICT, PROP 1

(Seeks an additional \$0.636 per \$1,000 valuation in local property taxes to fund capital improvements. Projected additional revenues are estimated to be \$650,000 each year beginning 2018, 2019, and 2020.

A **YES** vote is recommended.

FIRE PROTECTION DIST NO. 3—LACEY

(Seeks to issue \$19,975.147 of bonds to construct a new station 34 and convert the existing station 34 into a training center.

This proposition should be **REJECTED**
